GENERAL TOPIC	SUMMARY	
General	North Dakota initially closed or curtailed certain businesses and venues in March 2020, and allowed businesses to start reopening under a "Smart Restart" plan in May 2020. Protocols applicable to each industry category are posted at ND Smart Restart Protocols.	
	The capacity and other requirements have been dialed up and down from time to time, depending on the risk levels. For example, in November 2020, Exec Order 2020-43 was passed, increasing restrictions on gatherings and businesses. In December, 2020, certain of these restrictions were eased under Exec Order 2020-43.3.

Shelter in Place	No stay at home orders were issued	
Businesses - Generally	Most businesses are open, and required or strongly urged to comply with the applicable ND Smart Restart Protocols. There are Universal Protocols applicable to all businesses, as well as industry-specific protocols. Protocols include a broad range of requirements, including relating to distancing, sanitation and hygiene, CDC guidelines, face coverings, notices, gatherings, limits on occupancy, and the like.	
Restaurants/Bars	Bars, restaurants and other food service establishments have been operating at up to 50 percent of their licensed seated capacity, not to exceed 150 patrons, since Nov. 16, 2020. The capacity limits were one of several mitigation measures announced Nov. 13 to slow the
