General	Directed Health Measures are issued on a county-by-county basis, and have varied over time and by county. In November, 2020, more restrictive public health measures were adopted for application across the state, and extended through the month of December. Gatherings	Restrictions on gatherings of more than 10 persons (excluding staff) in a room or indoor or outdoor space. Broad list of exclusions: as airports and other areas of transit, grocery and retail stores, offices, factories, logistics centers, places of worship, etc. Gatherings are restricted to: seventy-five percent (75%) for an indoor facility's applicable rated occupancy (excluding staff), and one-hundred percent (100%) for an outdoor facility's applicable rated occupancy (excluding staff).

Restrictions	restrictions on businesses, typically including: • Restaurants/bars – table occupancy limits, spacing and other requirements • Gyms/Fitness clubs – spacing requirements
