#### A DECADE OF PROGRESS: FROM CAPE WIND TO NOW

- »Development of Renewable Leasing Program under OCSLA
  - Resolved uncertainty over:
    - seabed ownership
    - ability to construct and operate OSW projects
  - Replaced amorphous "Public Interest" review standard under Section 10 of the River and Harbors Act of 1898
- »Continued Development of Regulatory Process
  - Extensive State-specific stakeholder involvement process
  - Project Design Envelope Guidance
  - Expected improvements to SAP and Decommissioning processes

### A DECADE OF PROGRESS: FROM CAPE WIND TO NOW

- »Streamlining of Federal Permitting Process
  - FAST-41 Program
  - One Federal Decision MQU
- »Proliferation of State OSW Incentive Programs
  - Increased emphasis on addressing climate change
  - Desire to capture economic / employment benefits
- »Improvement in Technology = Reduction in Cost

#### BUT CHALLENGES REMAIN TO BE ADDRESSED

- »Can the Stakeholder Process Actually Produce Consensus?
  - Energy production v. Fisheries v. Visual v. Sensitive Species
  - Ability remains to shape the Administrative Record on all sides
- »Will the Regulatory and Permitting Process Improvements Produce Timely and Defensible Results?
  - Information sufficiency for:
    - ESA and MMPA coordination
    - NEPA / Cumulative Impact reviews
      - Supply Chain build-out, sequential / multiple projects or leases
  - Ability to respond to comments / develop Administrative Record?

#### BUT CHALLENGES REMAIN TO BE ADDRESSED

- »How will the environmental community and other stakeholders respond?
  - Will the perfect be the enemy of the good?
  - Is Fisheries Survival Fund an indication of more to come?
- »And What About Offshore Transmission Systems?
- »Potential Impact on Ability to Capture and Move Beyond State Incentive Programs
